Donna A. Brock hails from Los Angeles, California, and entered the United States Army in 1979 as a 91B Combat Medic. She honorably served for more than 35 years, culminating her career as the Command Sergeant Major of U.S. Army Medical Command and as the senior enlisted advisor to the Army Surgeon General.

At the time of her retirement in 2015, Donna Brock was the longest-serving enlisted woman still on active duty in the United States Army. Throughout her distinguished career, she served in every Noncommissioned Officer leadership position and also performed duties as a Drill Sergeant, Sergeants Major Course Instructor, Faculty Advisor, and Mentor at the U.S. Army Sergeants Major Academy (USASMA). In addition, she served on the Sergeant Major of the Army's Board of Directors and as the senior enlisted female advisor and mentor.

Today, Donna Brock's portrait hangs in Medical Command executive facilities across the military, recognizing her lasting legacy of leadership and service. She is now a small business owner of Brock LMC, an Executive Coach, and a Community Coach for Together With Veterans (TWV), where she works to help prevent veteran suicide in rural America.
